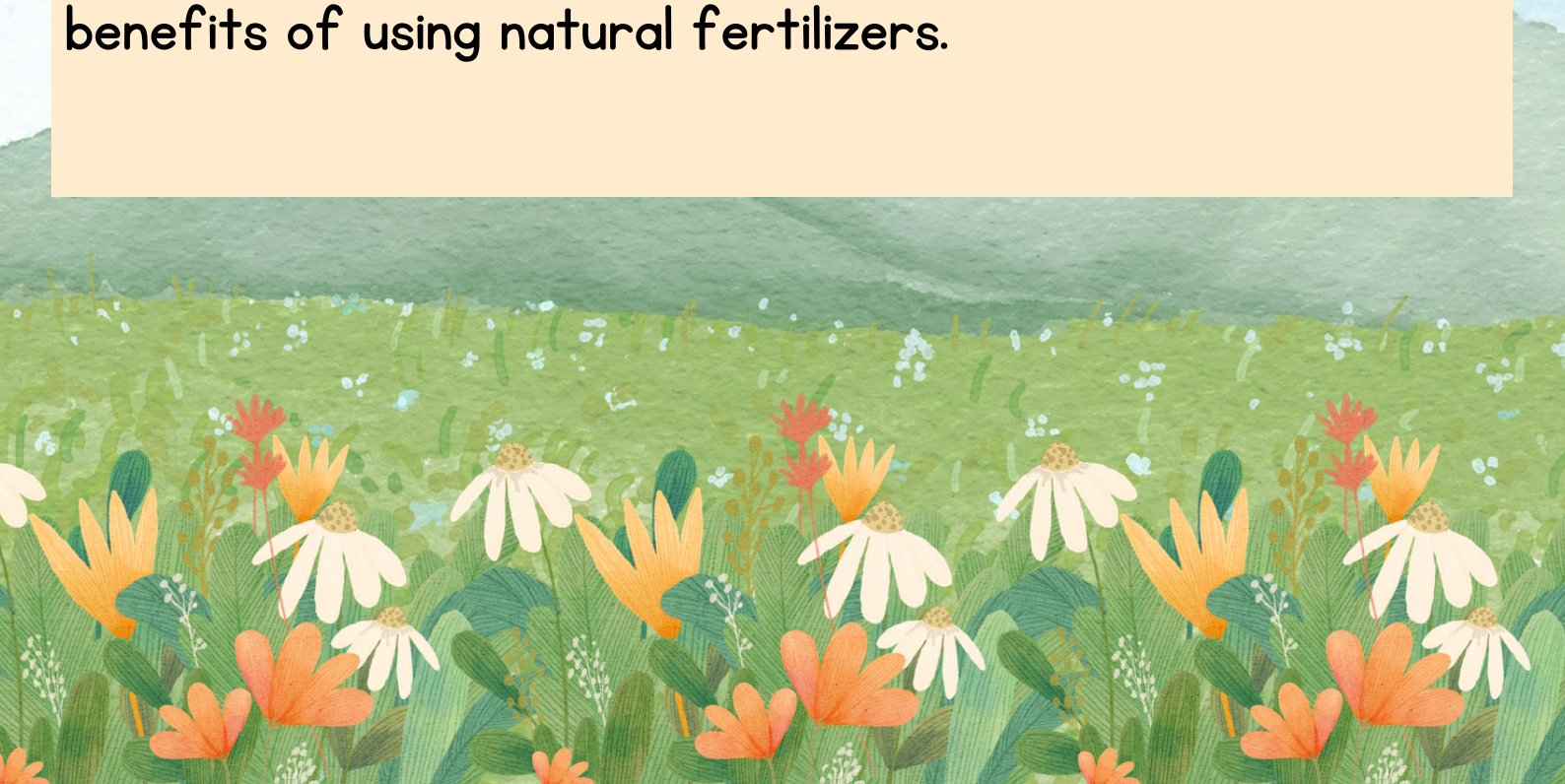
Activity Introduction

The activity allowed the children to learn about seasonal crops and common creatures found on farmland, such as insects. It helped them understand the relationship between plants and animals. Through hands-on experience, our children have learned more about organic farming, including weeding, loosening the soil, sowing seeds, and watering. They did the difficult work farmers normally do, thereby developing a habit of appreciating food. In addition, the entire experience guided the children to explore different crops, fostering a sense of respect and curiosity for nature as well as building an awareness of environmental conservation.



Learning Outcomes

Through close observation and exploration of various crops, the children have deepened their understanding of each crop, learned to cherish and care for nature, and understood the importance of biodiversity conservation. In addition, by personally experiencing farming tasks—such as weeding, loosening the soil, sowing seeds, and watering—they have learned about the origins of food, experienced the hard work of farmers, and developed an attitude of appreciation for food. During the activity, the guide's explanations helped enhance the children's knowledge of environmental protection and organic farming, such as how fertilizer is derived from animal manure and the benefits of using natural fertilizers.
